TANGA, TANZANIA

Tanga has a population of 54 million with 850,000 MU members. The Diocese encourages membership, and Mothers' Union has been heralded as one of the main agents in the growth of the Anglican Communion in the Diocese.

Members are working hard to alleviate poverty through seminars Introducing savings and credit schemes, training women to run a small businesses and thus become contributors to family security. A recent visitor reported seeing a sewing school operating 40 treadle sewing machines, a pig raising enterprise to fund the extension of a church building now too small for a growing congregation and MU support of safe house refuge for young women fleeing Female Genital Mutilation.

OGONI, NIGERIA

Mothers' Union has 60,000 members in a population of 213.4 million Nigerians, and has been an active force for over a hundred years. They work closely with the Women's Guild and are involved in hospital visiting, health clinics, support for widows and orphans, vocational training, orphan care and prison ministry. The complex humanitarian crisis and political instability has resulted in 60% of the population living below the poverty line and alarming unemployment. A growing refugee population from the Cameroon unrest adds to this dire situation.

Loving Father, we pray for the Mothers' Union workers in this troubled country. Bless their leaders and give them the strength and wisdom to guide the faithful workers In Ogoni. Fill them with love and may they be upheld by our prayers.

MANICALAND, ZIMBABWE

The population Of Manicaland is just over 2 million, the second largest Provence in Zimbabwe. Mothers' Union has 20,900 members and they are regarded as the backbone of the church. In May, thousands of MU members gathered together in their colourful outfits, many in MU "uniforms", to dance, sing, play their drums and listen to speakers.

This event was televised by Anglican TV which is becoming an effective, evangelical outreach in Central Africa. Last September, MU received a grant to start projects to sustain families in need.

Bless their President, Eunice Ruwona in her mission to build schools on government granted land to foster the education of young women to live independent and fruitful lives.

MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA

Australia has a population of 25 million and has 6244 MU members serving within 23 Diocesan areas. In Melbourne, among our 35 branches, we are continuing to explore our current theme "Transformation - NOW" under the guidance of our new Diocesan President, Karen Hayden. Karen was commissioned at St Paul's Cathedral at our Lady Day service and is eagerly visiting branches around the Diocese to meet members and share ideas. Karen sees MU as a "two tier" organisation, firstly, as prayerful and supportive fellowship and secondly, as a group actively concerned with social justice issues. This year money raised was sent to the Bendigo Diocese to buy heaters for those still living in caravans after the devastating floods last year. The Karen Nursery School in Myanmar is also a Melbourne project which is supported annually. The "It's in the Bag" appeal, where personal hygiene items are packed into handbags for distribution to the needy continues, as does the knitting of cot covers, beanies, fiddle rugs and trauma teddies for hospitals and other charities. Representatives from MU will participate in the ecumenical service, "Holding the Light", for domestic violence victims later this year.

Lord God, we thank you for all who have dedicated their time to serving you within our branches. We pray that you will bless our new President Karen as she works amongst our Diocese. May Transformation enliven our branches NOW and bring light and love in our outreach.

BOGA DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO

With a population of 96 million, Boga Mothers' Union boasts 26,904 members. The Bishop's ongoing Harvest Appeal seeks to break the ongoing cycle of poverty, illiteracy and gender based violence. Mugisa Isingoma, the MU President of Boga also stands as the Moderator of United Women for Peace and Social Promotion and is linked to the Anglican Women's Network. She works to shift perception that women are passive tools for development by providing leadership training and self awareness, courses to reduce the incidence of domestic violence and challenge the root causes of injustice. Projects to improve conditions in society are designed to improve daily life for women and children in particular.

CARLISE, ENGLAND

Great Britain and Northern Ireland have 38,000 Mothers' Union, members, the Diocese of Carlisle having 950 members spread amongst 51 branches. In the latest newsletter, their President, Deb Lee, highlights the power of connection in meetings and through their regular activities, which include caring for children in the play area at Haverigg prison, providing hospitals and hostels with emergency toiletry bags, and providing pastoral care services in aged care residences. MU members also assist in numerous churches in Sunday School and Messy Church programs. A new initiative this year is providing holidays for families who have been facing difficult times in a leased caravan at St Bees. Their Summer of Hope Appeal raises money for literacy programs in Africa which empower women and improve their status in the community, resulting in increased income, improved hygiene and less domestic violence. Deb will again "get on her bike and cycle to York as a fundraiser. Branches are being encouraged to try different ways to conduct their meetings with the Diocese offering two on line evening sessions.

May the Diocese of Carlisle Mothers Union be blessed as they reach out to distressed families with the offer of a caravan holiday this summer. Bless the families involved, especially the children. Be with their President Deb as she cycles to York and keep her safe. We pray through Jesus Christ our Lord.
